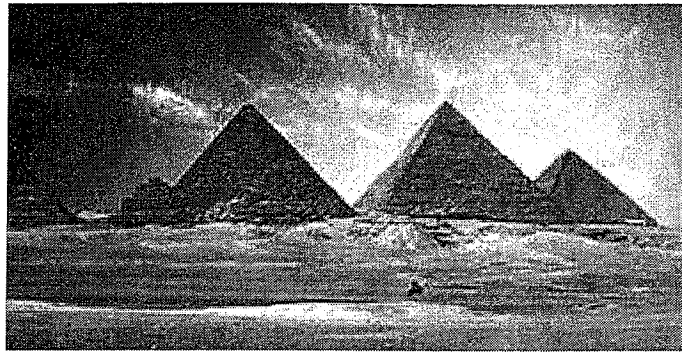


Egyptian Social Pyramid Project



We have recently been studying the History and Geography of Ancient Egypt in class. One interesting aspect of Egyptian History is the way they viewed social classes. Your book contends that there were at least 5 classes (Government Officials, Priests, Scribes, Artisans and Peasants). We will also include the Pharaoh.

- Get into a group of 4 or less
- Divide up the various panels that will make up your pyramid (Approximately $\frac{1}{4}$ sheet of Paper) There are 6 Peasant, 5 Artisan, 4 Scribes, 3 Priests, 2 Government Officials and 1 Pharaoh. Each Person will have 5 panels and one lucky person will have 6! ($5 + 5 + 5 + 6 = 21$)
- Each panel must be a visual representation of the Daily Life of that social class. (Ex. You might show Peasants building the Pyramids, or the Scribes painstakingly writing out royal edicts)
- All panels must be fully colored and high quality work
- When Finished it should be taped together in the following configuration:
